Capacity

- The intellectual capacity and maturity of judgment to complete a program of graduate study
- The ability to undertake the Graduate Program in addition to present or contemplated job requirements

Motivation

- The drive and stamina necessary for sustaining a commitment to this course of study
- The extent to which family, colleagues, and employer are likely to be supportive of this undertaking

Appropriateness

- Current placement of the applicant in the management hierarchy (top, middle, or lower)
- Likelihood that the applicant will rise in management ranks
