



An Honours degree in Business Administration with an Accounting Honours Concentration requires a minimum of 132 units which must include:

- a) Lower division requirements
- b) WQB requirements
- c) Non-Bus and Non-Buec units
- d) Business core courses
- e) Accounting Concentration
- f) Three Bus 400+ courses
- g) 12 units of approved Bus 400+
- h) Electives at the 100+ or 200+ or 300+ or 400+ levels

Students may apply for the honours accounting concentration once they have completed their lower division requirements, completed at least 15 units of upper division BUS units, and have either completed or enrolled in BUS 320 and 360W. Admission is on a competitive basis. Upon completion of BUS 320 and 360W with a minimum grade of C+ the admission decision will be made.

Only students formally admitted to the accounting honours concentration will be permitted to enrol in accounting courses in the 300 and 400 divisions (with the exception of BUS 320).

An honours degree has the following grade point average requirements for entry into, continuance in the program:

3.00 cgpa overall

3.00 GPA overall for all upper division BUS and BUEC courses

For graduation, students must also meet the GPA's in accordance with the University and Faculty of Business Administration policies.

Within your final 72 units of your 132 units, you must complete at least:

57 units of upper division work

42 units of Upper Division Bus or Buec + 15 units of Upper Division Bus or Buec or electives

15 units of lower or upper division Bus or Buec or elective.

These hour requirements would be fulfilled from category d), e), f) g), and h).

b) Writing, Quantitative and Breadth Requirements (WQB) if admitted to SFU Fall 06 onward

Writing

Students are required to complete 6 units of "W" course work in their degree, one of which must be an upper division (300 or 400 level) course. All the English courses and Phil 100W and Phil 120W, of which you need 2 for admission to SFU Business, are "W" courses. BUS 360W, a Business Core Course, will meet the Writing Upper Division requirement.

Quantitative

Students are required to complete 6 units of "Q" course work in their degree. Since 6 courses required for the BBA are designated "Q" courses, students will meet this requirement while completing their BBA.

Breadth

Students are required to complete 24 units of "B" course work in their degree.

- 6 units of Social Sciences (B-Soc) - can be met with Econ 103 and 105
- 6 units of Humanities (B-Hum)
- 6 units of Science (B-Sc)
- 6 units of Undesignated Breadth (UB) - can be met within the 50 Non-BUS or non-BUEC unit requirement.

*If admitted to SFU before Fall 06, you must complete Group requirements a), b) and c)

c) 50 units of non-Business, non-Buec units

Students must complete a minimum of 50 units of non-Bus or non-Buec courses within their degree requirement. These courses are generally, though not necessarily, completed in the first half of a degree and may be at any level. For example: Math 157. These units would normally come from categories a), b) and e).

d) Business core courses

Require all of:

- Bus 303-3 - Business, Society and Ethics
- Bus 312-4 - Introduction to Finance
- Bus 336-4 - Data and Decisions II
- Bus 343-3 - Introduction to Marketing
- Bus 360W-4 - Business Communication
- Bus 393-3 - Commercial Law
- Bus 478-3 - Seminar in Administrative Policy

and one of:

- Bus 374-3 - Organization Theory
- Bus 381-3 - Introduction to Human Resource Management

Core courses must have a minimum grade of C- to meet graduation requirements.

e) Accounting Honours Concentration

Students complete an Accounting Honours Concentration by completing the courses specified below:

- BUS 251-3 Financial Accounting I
- BUS 254-3 Managerial Accounting I
- BUS 320-3 Financial Accounting: Assets
- BUS 321-3 Financial Accounting: Equities
- BUS 322-3 Intermediate Managerial Accounting
- BUS 329-4 Income Tax for Business Decision-Making
- BUS 420-3 Advanced Accounting
- BUS 421-3 Accounting Theory
- BUS 424-3 Advanced Managerial Accounting
- BUS 426-3 Auditing and Assurance: Concepts and Methods

*One of the Bus 400 level accounting courses can be used towards the four Bus 4xx honours course requirements.

f) Bus 400+ level course requirement

Students are required to complete at least three 400+ level Business or Buec courses within their degree. This requirement is usually met within a student's area(s) of concentration.

Bus 478 and the Bus 425 co-op practicum will not count towards this requirement.

g) 12 units of Bus 400+ Honours requirement

These units are above and beyond the requirements of a Major in Business Administration.
